Villa Des Croix Viognier 2017 (France) £ 21
Deliciously aromatic with ripe flavours of apricot and nectarine and a dry finish

Calusari, Pinot Grigio, Romania, 2017 £ 5.75 £ 7.5 £ 22
This expression of Pinot Grigio is far superior to any Italian at this price.

From Henri Bourgeois' family run winery, this award winning Sancerre (that is not a Sancerre, ask staff) is nicely aromatic with a well-rounded flavour profile.

Gusbourne, Guinevere Chardonnay, Kent, England, 2013 £ 45
A bracing acidity and beguiling minerality are more akin to what you might expect to find in fine Burgundies.
Especially as the flavours reveal notes of vanilla and hot buttered toast.

Dufouleur Pere et Fils, Meursault, Bourgogne, France, 2015 £ 65
A rich and opulent white wine with aromas of artisan Marmalade thickly spread on freshly baked bread. Buy it to believe it.
